ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Candidates for Postgraduate admissions MUST possess five (5) credit passes at O' Level including English Language and Mathematics.

A. Postgraduate Diploma Programmes

A candidate with at least Third Class degree in a related field OR HND holders with a minimum of UPPER CREDIT from recognized institutions.

B. Master's Programme

Bachelor's degree from a recognized University with a minimum of Second Class Honours (Lower Division) in the relevant discipline OR Candidates with a PGD at credit level pass (i.e. at least 3.50 on 5.00 point scale).

C. Doctor of Philosophy Programmes

Candidate must possess Masters degree with a CGPA of at least 3.50 on a 5.00 point scale.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

SINCE inception the university has been undergoing a lot of physical development. Right from the entrance of the University, the sports complex has been developed for the physical exercise of students and staff. Two hostels, each with a capacity to accommodate 640 students had been completed. We have just completed a twin hostel with 300-bed spaces. The access road to the hostel has also been tarred. The Law Faculty had been constructed and first set of law students in the 2020/2021 academic session had commenced after the NUC came for Resource Verification in October last year. The architectural and mechanical drawings for our college of Medicine has been completed. A new University Medical Centre is under construction to ensure that we have a well-equipped medical facility to cater to our students and staff. This is most crucial to us, especially in these present times of living with the threat of the Covid-19 pandemic. We have also completed the architectural designs and the Bill of Quantities for Rev Sister Hostel and the Chaplain's House.. It has become a priority project for us because currently there are over 100 Rev Sisters sponsored by different groups to VERITAS University.

PROFILE OF
**REV. FR. PROF. ICHOKU
EMENTA HYACINTH**
VICE-CHANCELLOR OF VERITAS UNIVERSITY



Rev Fr Professor Hyacinth Eme Ichoku is a priest of the Catholic Diocese of Awka, Anambra State, and a Professor of Development Microeconomics with primary interest in Health Economics. Until his appointment as the Vice-Chancellor of Veritas University Abuja in 2018, he was a Professor at the Department of Economics at the University of Nigeria, Nsukka (UNN) where he taught Microeconomics, Econometrics and Public Finance. His academic training started with degrees in Philosophy and Divinity in 1984 and 1988, respectively. After serving as the Finance Administrator in the Catholic Institute of West Africa (1989-1992) he went to study Economics at the University of Nigeria Nsukka where he obtained a BSc degree in Economics in 1998. He was awarded the Scholarship of the Government of Sweden (SIDA fellowship) to do his Master's Degree at the University of Cape Town (South Africa) in 1999 where he graduated with Distinction in Dissertation in year 2000 and enrolled for his PhD in 2002 before he was recalled to take up teaching appointment in the Department of Economics, UNN. He combined this lecturing assignment in UNN with his PhD Research at the University of Cape until he was awarded a PhD in 2006 when returned fully to Nigeria.

Between 2003 and 2012 he combined intensive classroom teaching and extensive research for which he was awarded several international research grants including research grants from IDRC Canada, World Health Organization (WHO), National Research Foundation of South Africa, and African Economic Research Consortium (AERC) Nairobi which sponsored his PhD field research. He also published over 40 papers in international peer reviewed journals in the fields of health economics and general development microeconomics. For his contributions to his field of research interest he was promoted to the rank of Professor by the UNN Governing Council with effect from 2012.

Rev Professor Ichoku has had a wide range of field experience from consultancies undertaking for several international organizations including World Bank, USAID, DFID, EU, WHO, IDRC, Results for Development (USA), Apt Associates among others.

He has served as PhD Examiner to University of Cape Town (South Africa), North West University (South Africa), University of Lagos, and Nnamdi Azikiwe University (Awka) among others. He led an international accreditation team to University of Technology Namibia, and was a member of international accreditation to St Augustine College, Johannesburg.

Apart from his regular teaching and research Rev Prof Ichoku also served the University of Nigeria Nsukka in several capacities and chaired over 10 Committees of the University. He was the Director of Academic Planning of the University from 2011 to 2014 and the Director of Institute of Maritime Studies from 2014 to 2018. It was while still serving in this capacity that he was appointed the Vice-Chancellor of Veritas University in September 2018.

Introduction

It is my pleasure and honour to welcome you all here today, as we celebrate yet another milestone in the history of Veritas University. Today, we not only celebrate the official graduation of this special cohort of students, we also celebrate the 10th Convocation Ceremony of Veritas University. Therefore, it is right to state that this Convocation Ceremony represents a decade of hard work and dedication; a decade of striving for excellence and resilience in the fulfilment of the mission and vision of the Founding Fathers of this institution, who in their wisdom and knowledge thought it wise to establish in Nigeria a university in the noble tradition of great Catholic universities across the world. Today, as we unfold the score card of Veritas University, Abuja, I am pleased to see the many wonderful faces of our students who in their calm and collective resolve, represent the future of Nigeria. I am also pleased to see the faces of joy and pride of parents and guardians of our students, whose determination to give their children the very best education in Nigeria, has culminated in the graduation of their wards from our university today.

New Academic Programmes of the University

Ladies and gentlemen, since our last Convocation

Ceremony on January 30, 2021, significant progress has been recorded in the University. I am pleased to inform you that the first set of students have been admitted into our Law Faculty and they have commenced academic activities. As was the plan from inception, the faculty is being positioned to become one of the very best faculties of Law in the country in the nearest future. It may interest you to note that our Law Faculty currently has among its very dedicated and competent staff three erudite Professors of Law who are also Senior Advocates of Nigeria. All efforts are being made to complete the Justice Idigbe Faculty of Law Building and we hope that before the end of the first quarter of 2022 our Law Faculty will move from its present location to its own permanent building.

In addition, the National Universities Commission has sent its teams for Resource Verification for other new undergraduate and graduate programmes. The new undergraduate programmes include Pharmacy, Nursing, and Medical Laboratory Science. The graduate programmes include MSc in Computer Science, M.Ed in Counselling, PhD Accounting, PhD English and Literary Studies, and PhD Mass Communication. We shall start admitting students into these programmes as soon as we receive approval from the regulatory authority. The introduction of these new programmes will also broaden the options available to students.

Furthermore, in keeping with our policy of operating within the ambit of the law and regulatory authorities, it is important to note that all our programmes are accredited by the National Universities Commission and other professional regulatory bodies.

An important part of our university policy trust is to ensure that all our students in professional programmes are exposed to professional experience. In this respect our Accounting and Computer Science are also enrolled with their relevant professional bodies so that the students do not just graduate with academic degrees, they have in addition professional certificates.

Infrastructural Developments

New Hostels: I am happy to report today that the PAETO Mega female hostel built under Private-Private Partnership (PPP) arrangement has now been completed. This hostel has capacity for 674 bed-spaces and has all the facilities that a student needs to have a comfortable accommodation. We are expecting two more new hostel under the same PPP arrangement to commence soon. I would like to commend Chief Pius Etokhona for keeping faith with Veritas University in spite

of the economic and financial challenges arising from Covid-19, insecurity and hyperinflation in the economy in the last two years. We are grateful to him and I acknowledge the huge sacrifices he has had to make in this regard.

We have also just completed a new male hostel with capacity for 300 students. This hostel has also self-contained rooms with sufficient leg-rooms for students. These hostels have significantly improved our capacity to enroll new students and we are expecting the enrollment of more students before our matriculation on a date to be confirmed by the Senate of the University.

Faculty of Health Sciences Building

The construction of the Faculty of Health Sciences building is currently in progress. It is a 2-storey building with over 24 laboratories and classrooms and 23 offices. We expect the building to be ready by October 2022 so that the proposed new programmes: Pharmacy, Nursing and Medical Lab Science will move in there by next academic session.

The Proposed Engineering and Innovation Building

An engineering and innovation center remains one of our most critical needs. The Department of Computer and Information Technology is currently the most populated departments in our university. There are over 500 students in our Engineering and Computer Science programmes. In view of this, we desperately need and propose to build an innovation hub where students will be exposed to innovation ideas. This will serve as our launchpad for interaction with other centers of innovation both in and outside Nigeria. We have already prepared the architectural design for this Centre but it can only become a reality if we find donors to sponsor this project.

The New University Clinic

We have now completed the new university clinic and waiting to equip it with modern medical equipment to serve the health needs of our students and staff. The clinic currently has three regular doctors and a Youth Service doctor and over 18 nurses and other paramedics that oversee the health of our staff and students.

New Staff building

Part of our strategy for maintenance discipline among students in the university is to have staff that leave close to students. Currently we have one or more hostel administrators living with students in each of our hostels. In addition, we have Hostel Masters who oversee the overall discipline of students in these hostels. We are now building a staff house for key staff who will be superintending the university at all times. The first phase of this staff building is currently under construction and we are hoping it will be completed before the end of the 1st Quarter of 2022.

The Chaplain's House

The University Chaplaincy has a critical role to play in assisting the building up of the spiritual life of the students and staff. Unfortunately, our chaplain currently lives outside of the university which makes it difficult for students to have unencumbered access to him. We have

now started the foundation of the chaplain's house beside the chapel. We thank the Knights of St Mulumba for the seed donation which has enabled us to commence the construction.

The E-Library

We want to express our gratitude to the Papal Knights who are currently funding the building of the university e-Library. This e-library building has now been roofed and we are expecting it to be completed before the 2nd Quarter of 2022. Its completion will be indeed a big relief to the university.

The Lecture Auditorium

We want to express our deep gratitude to the Laity Council of Nigeria who recently returned to site to continue the construction of the Lecture Auditorium near the university Sport- Complex after many years. We hope they will now speed up work on this project to ease pressure on our lecture facilities.

Students Welfare

The University has a provision for assisting students from poor financial background. A number of our students who are sponsored by organizations and individuals, or some who lose a parent or sponsor in the course of their studies find it difficult to meet their basic needs for food and toiletries. The Veritas University Students Welfare Committee supports such students through our Students' Welfare Fund. However, in the face of limited resources the committee is unable to meet the ever-increasing needs of these students. We want to thank Mrs Isatou Batonon, a Gambian, who recently donated N2.5 million to this welfare fund. We would also want to appeal to those who may be touched to contribute to this welfare fund to contact the Chair of the Students Welfare Committee Dr Mrs Ini Ekpe (08025399848).

Security Challenges

As we are all aware, the present security challenges in the country have taken its toll on the education sector in the country with a number of higher institutions having suffered incidences of abductions of staff and students. At Veritas University, we have had to beef up our security architecture, such that we presently have a combined team of men of the Nigerian Army, Nigeria Police Force, our own Veritas Armed Guards and Private Security firm to provide security on campus and around the axis of the local host community. We are also supporting the operations of the Vigilante groups in all the communities around us in order to create a security buffer zone around the university.

Management is leaving no stone unturned in order to ensure that our campus is safe and serene for academic studies and research. Presently we spend over N6million naira monthly on security personnel only. We have had to acquire licensed fire arms and ammunitions for our armed guards as well as three vans for security patrol in and around the campus. We have also embarked on the fencing of all the hostels on campus as advised by the Commissioner of Police of the FCT. We are currently investing N15 million on the first phase of installation of short circuit cameras (CCTV) to monitor

movements within the campus. All these measures are taken because the continued existence of this University is hinged on having a secure and safe environment for learning.

Performance of our Students

We want to acknowledge that the performance of our students in general gives us encouragement. Many of our graduates have found very good jobs in the labor market in spite of the tough economic times. Many have got employed in the financial and real sectors of the economy even as many are reporting excellent performance universities abroad. In the 2021 edition of Big Brother Nigeria show, one of our graduates Tsakute Jona popularly known as Saskay who is currently on Youth Service demonstrated that even in such a mundane environment a candidate with solid training and character could make a difference. She was the youngest among all the housemates but she showed great maturity and character. Veritas University is very proud of her. Recently also one of our students in the Department of Entrepreneurship, Abel Ayuba, was invited to Berlin, in Germany to address a global audience on the software he is currently developing with his team in Veritas University. He was simply amazing. In November, our team of debaters led by Edwin Ocheido and Ghenga competed with teams of debaters from across the country in the National Assembly. They distinguished themselves and were second only to the team from the University of Lagos.

Acknowledgements

Ladies and gentlemen, as we celebrate our 10th Convocation Ceremony, it is only reasonable that I acknowledge some of the people who have worked hard and contributed to the development of Veritas University. In this regard, I wish to acknowledge the pioneer members of Management in Obehie led by the first Vice-Chancellor of Veritas University, late Rev. Fr. Prof. Justin Ukpong, the pioneer Registrar, Chief Mojisola Ladipo, mni, the pioneer Bursar, Mrs. Elizabeth Opara and the pioneer University Librarian, the late Mrs. Ekwere-Elizabeth Akpan. Their hard work and dedication laid a solid foundation for the successful take off of the University and we shall always owe a debt of gratitude to them for their sacrifices towards the development of Veritas University.

I also wish to honour the memory of the second Vice-Chancellor of Veritas University, the late Prof. David Ker, OON whom we lost in 2021. During his reign at the helm of affairs he was able to secure full accreditation for all existing programmes of the University at the time, thereby giving the University a strong footing to forge ahead. In the same vein I wish to honour the memory of the second University Librarian, Mr. Joseph Anafulu. A seasoned librarian and human encyclopedia, his headship of the library ensured that we were never found wanting whenever the regulatory authorities visited. Also, in a special way, I wish to thank my immediate predecessor, Prof. Michael Kwanashie, and his team who managed the difficult movement of the university from Obehie to Abuja campus. Their courage and

commitment to Veritas University are deeply appreciated. In spite of having completed his tenure as the third Vice-Chancellor of Veritas University, Prof Kwanashie was, on his retirement from Ahmadu Bello University, requested and he graciously accepted to return as a Professor in the Department of Economics, thereby bringing his years of experience in the public and private sector to the benefit of our undergraduate and postgraduate students. I also wish to salute the immediate past Registrar and Bursar, Rev. Fr. Dr. Barr. Peter Ik. Okonkwo and Rev. Sr. Grace Akpan, respectively, for their hard work and sacrifice in the success story of Veritas University. The Archbishop of Abuja, his grace, Ignatius Ayau Kaigama expresses high sense of satisfaction with the developmental stride of Veritas University Abuja, under the leadership of Rev. Fr. According the Archbishop, what came as a resolution of the Catholic Bishops Conference of Nigeria in March 2002, has grown to such a magnificent University campus to his amazement. Also remembering how the University started, His Grace, recalled few eminent Nigerians whose ideas contributed to forming the pillars of the institution today. Among them was Prof. Charles Soludo, former Governor of Central Bank of Nigeria and Governor elect, Anambra State.

According to the Archbishop, it can only take the kind of foresightedness of the Vice Chancellor, Rev. Fr. Prof. Hyacinth Ichoku, to pilot affairs of the University in

accordance with the dreams of the founders of the institution. His Grace, who is also the Chancellor of Veritas University, visited barely a week after the representative of His Holiness Pope Francis, was at the University to bless some projects including the ultramodern Female Hostel block.

The Archbishop's visit is to bring to a climax, the year of St. Joseph in which His Holiness the Pope declared in the Apostolic letter entitled, "Patris Corde" (With a father's Heart) in 2020. In his welcome address the Vice Chancellor, Rev. Fr. Prof. Ichoku assured the Archbishop of the commitment of the Management as well as staff of Veritas University, Abuja, towards fulfilling the vision of the founding fathers of the institution, which is to form students holistically in accordance with the Catholic principles and committed to a culture of excellence that will make the University rank among the best in the world.

MAN CAN REST IN NOTHING BUT GOD – FILIPAZZI

The Archbishop, Antonio Guido Filipazzi, the Nuncio to Nigeria, on Wednesday, 1st December, decried how man has forgotten the essence of existence, and gone in search of mundane and inferior things. He stated this while presiding over the holy mass at Veritas University Abuja, as part of activities to usher in the 2021/2022 academic calendar.

According to him, only God satisfies, which indefinitely, exceeds all other pleasures that man seeks. This essentially is the ultimate goal of university education. The diplomat, also took a tour round the various development projects under the administration of the

incumbent Vice Chancellor, Rev. Fr. Prof. Hyacinth Ichoku, including the ultramodern girls hostel. The representative of his Holiness Pope Francis, was overwhelmed with joy at the sight of massive projects ongoing simultaneously, at different locations of the University, despite the global economic recession.

The Vice Chancellor, while welcoming the clergy amidst the mammoth crowd of staff and students, said the visit was symbolic and in recognition of the prominent position of Veritas University, as a fast growing private university in Nigeria. It would be recalled that this is the second diplomatic visit to Veritas University, barely a week after the Embassy of the United States, visited.
